INTRODUCTION

The results of this health check report come from the Medical Training Survey (2019) conducted by the Medical Board of Australia, a national, profession-wide survey of all doctors in training in Australia, which was completed on a voluntary basis¹.

The purpose of this document is to provide a comparison of the training experience between different specialty training pathways and identify areas of excellent experience as well as areas for improvement. The results highlight important areas where Specialist Medical Colleges and Health services can focus on and collaborate to improve the quality of vocational training and will inform AMA advocacy in this area.

DISCLAIMER

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Comparison of results among specialities must be made with caution, as the survey did not involve a probabilistic sampling frame, but instead was open to all doctors in training in Australia, achieving a response rate of 26.8 per cent². Further, as doctors were not randomly allocated to specialist colleges, differences in attitudes and expectations could not be controlled for. Other important covariables (i.e. age, training level, domestic/ international medical training) were also not controlled for. These issues introduce biases into the results which cannot be accounted for. Thus, all differences among trainee experiences should be interpreted as specific only to survey respondents and must not be interpreted as representative of the experiences of all doctors in training in Australia.

METHODS

The up and down arrows in the table indicate that respondents of the relevant speciality were more or less likely, respectively, to respond affirmatively to the given question. This was determined by dividing the observed number of affirmative responses within each specialty by the number of expected affirmative responses given the gender breakdown within each specialty. If the resulting ratio was more or less than 10% the overall sample average, then an up or down arrow was given respectively.

A dash indicates the experience was within 10 per cent of the overall sample average. The experience ratings were based on the average gender-adjusted responses within each domain. The letter ratings correspond to decrements of 5% between 100% and 0%, such that A+ represents a score falling between 95%-100%, A represents 90%-95% and so on. The lowest rating, F-, would represent a score of 15% or less. Note the results for some Colleges have not been reported due to small sample size. All analyses were undertaken by an independent statistician.

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
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KEY FINDINGS


Exam Feedback

32% reported receiving useful exam feedback.




Access to Mental **Health Services**

38% reported having access to mental health services.




Employment Concerns

Almost half (45%) of respondents agreed that they were concerned about their ability to secure employment at the end of their training.




Bullying, Discrimination & Harassment

1 in 5 experienced bullying, discrimination or harassment. Of these, 36% reported its occurrence. Once reported, it was followed-up half of the time.



Study Leave

66% reported having access to protected study time or leave.
