Ramping, Emergency Department overrun, and elective surgery waiting blowouts are contributing to avoidable mortality. Ramping, ED pressure, and longer than recommended surgery wait times are considered the domains of State and Territory Governments. They are, and we can't let State and Territory Governments off the hook, particularly in my home State of WA where our State government is the only government in Australia projecting a budget surplus this year.

Yet public hospitals are federally funded too. Public hospital pressures are occurring nationally. A national response is needed. I was astounded when the PM and Opposition Leader both told me several weeks back they do not intend to prioritise additional public hospital funding.

Every Australian needs to know the PM and Opposition Leader, along with their respective Minister and Shadow Minister, don't see public hospitals as their problem.

The Federal Government and Opposition don't see patients waiting in an ambulance to get into an Emergency Department as their problem. They don't see stretched doctors and nurses in overrun Emergency Departments as their problem. They don't see patients waiting years for simple surgeries as their problem.

I say this to Prime Minister Morrison and Opposition Leader Albanese. Every patient unable to be admitted to hospital in an emergency, every patient suffering some inconvenience or incapacity waiting for a surgery, and every doctor or nurse working above and beyond in a stretched public hospital system is your problem.

To Mr Morrison and Mr Albanese I extend my offer to work on a solution to better resource the nation's public hospital system in advance of the next election being called.
