

Barr Government's new Tax on GPs and Patients



You may have heard about the ACT Government's decision to impose a new payroll tax on GPs. Although payroll tax has applied to General Practices for many years, it has only applied to employees.

A recent legal case in NSW extended the operation of payroll tax to contractor GPs and now the ACT Government has decided that the tax will apply in Canberra.

What will this mean for patients?

Many general practices in Canberra are struggling already and their ongoing viability will be threatened by this new tax.

- We don't want to reduce the quality of our care
- We don't want to reduce the number of our nurses

This leaves us with little choice but to pass the cost of the new payroll tax onto patients
