Thankfully, water fluoridation is one of the easiest and most effective methods to decrease the prevalence and severity of oral disease across both child and adult populations. It is also supported by a robust and widely accepted body of research.

Despite this, we are alarmed by reports that Gympie Regional Council is considering stopping the provision of this important public health benefit to its community. Doctors and dentists continue to be distressed by increasing rates of tooth decay and associated poor health outcomes, particularly among children. They are also concerned by the widening dental health gap between patients living in regions such as Gympie and those in South East Queensland.

AMA Queensland calls on your Council to urgently reassure the Gympie community that it will continue to provide water fluoridation to protect our most vulnerable Queenslanders and ensure health equity with their metropolitan counterparts.
